Note to Parents:

While we don't definitively know when Gatherings will return to normal, we want the kids to continue in learning



about God and His word in all circumstances! We encourage all parents to listen to the sermon today before leading your children in family worship time.

Bible Reading for the Day: Genesis 1:26-31, 1 Corinthians 12:12-27

- Have your child grab a Bible, have a seat, and look up the passage that is going to be read for the day
- Focus on helping your child look up Scripture and help them remember the order of the books of the Bible. If they are at reading age, have them read the passage.
- If you don't have a Bible at home, you can go to this link to the text on <u>Bible Gateway</u>

Questions about Genesis Genesis 1:26-31, 1 Corinthians 12:12-27:

Note: If you are unsure of the answers to these questions, you are encouraged to re-watch today's video lesson or reread the passage

For Elementary-age kids:

- What do you think it means to be made in the image of God? Why is it important that *all* people were made in His image?
- What is prejudice? (click here for answer) Why is it wrong?
- What does it mean that all Christians are a part of the body of Christ?
- How should we respond when a member of the body of Christ is feeling hurt or afraid?

For Pre-K kids:

- What is an image?
- What do you think it means to be made in the image of God?
- Do you think all people were made in God's image? Why or why not? (reread Genesis 1:26 if needed)
- What is prejudice? (click here for answer) How can people have prejudice towards others?
- If we are all made in God's image, why is it wrong to have prejudice towards others?
- What does it mean that all Christians are a part of the body of Christ?
- How should we respond when a member of the body of Christ is feeling hurt or afraid?

Activity options: You may pick any of the activities below to add to your family worship this week. With each activity discuss ways you can show others that you value them because you know they are made in God's image.

- 1) If possible, **go for a walk** with your family and enjoy all the things God has made. Discuss that while creation is beautiful, people are different because they were created in God's image.
- 2) Look through **family photos together**. Look through them together and see if there are any people who look similar. The more time we spend with God, the more like Him we become.

- 3) Look around your house. In how many **shiny surfaces** can you see your reflection? Pray that you will always reflect God's love to others and remember that every person is made in God's image
- 4) Pass around a **mirror**. Have each person look in the mirror and say, "I am made in the image of God." Tell something about each person that makes them special.
- 5) Play a **guessing game**. Let children act out a person or animal. They can even verbally give clues to who they are. Others family members should guess what is being acted out. Remind children that while they aren't actually that person or that animal, they are showing an "image" that looks like that person/animal. Remind them that all people are created in the image of God.



6) **Make a mirror** with aluminum foil and paper. Use a sharpie to draw on the foil and write ways ALL people were made in the image of God.

Big Picture Question:

Practice asking your child today's Big Picture Question and have them respond with the following answer:

Parent: Why does every person have value?

Child: Because everyone is made in God's image!

Memory Verse: Philippians 4:19

- Review the following verse with your kids.
